The Hon. A. R. Addison, M.L.C., was Honorary Minister in the original Peake

Ministry, formed in June last, but retired from it when the portfolios were rearranged

in last December. He entered the Legislative Council as a member for the Northern District on the resignation of the late Mr. W. Wadham in 1888, and for upwards of 20 years has watched over the interests of that big electorate. He was born in Adelaide, in 1842, educated at St. Peter's College, and was trained in the National Bank, afterwards transferring to the South Australian Bank, and becoming manager of the Port Elliot branch. Subsequent to his marriage he joined his father-in-law (Mr. A.V. Bowman) in the milling business, and took

a keen interest in municipal work in the southern township. Over 30 years ago he went to Orroroo, where he became associated with Mr. Truelove in the milling industry. He has been a warden of St. Pauls, Orroroo, since its inception, is a son of the late Mr. T. P. Addison (Deputy Collector, of Customs), and an enthusiastic rifle shot and keen Liberal politician.
